**Venue:** Smt. Vimladevi Khyalilalji Vagarecha College of Nursing, Thane.

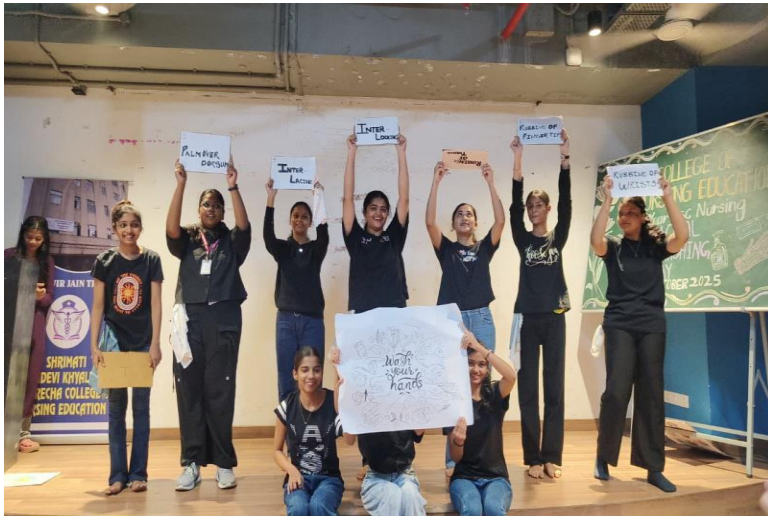
